

#### **TOT project**

The TOT City project is a collaboration between SUPSI (coordinator), University of Tsukuba (TIAS), National University of Singapore and New York University. It is a project started in 2020 and funded through a bilateral Opportunity grant with Asia from ETH-SERI (project n. OG 05-122017).

Mega-events, such as Olympic Games, are exemplifications of contemporary urban transformation. In order to understand the social, political and economic transformations in the urban realm particularly with regards to citizenship, transformation processes on the ground need to be analyzed from multiple angles, including a transnational perspective. TOT City aims at setting up such an analysis of mega events, examining the Tokyo Olympics 2020 and its implications for citizenship and the urban realm. A first forum was held in Tokyo in

February 2020 and included a selected audience of stakeholders and experts from Green Sports Alliance, Japan Sport Council and others. The resulting questions and ideas are currently being developed and addressed through onsite observations and qualitative interviews with key actors.

The aims of this second forum, hosted and co-organized in collaboration with the Embassy of Switzerland in Japan, are to discuss and share first results with an expert audience, consolidate findings, and define a further research agenda and publication.


